The Shakespeare Monologue Competition invites pupils from ISA members' schools to explore Shakespeare's plays and characters and test their acting abilities by performing a monologue. There is also the opportunity for students to write their own Shakespeare-inspired monologue.

Year Groups and Eligibility

Only schools whose Head is a Member with ISA are eligible to enter ISA competitions. Any pupils competing must be on the main school's admissions register, on the date of the event.

Our year groups follow the UK National Curriculum. For guidance on selecting the correct year group for your student(s), please refer to the UK system [here](#). When completing your application, please enter students according to the UK year group, even if your school uses a different age or stage structure.

Access and Inclusion

Competition Format

The first stage of this competition consists of an online qualification round. Successful entries will be invited to the final on **Friday 22 January 2027, Sibford School, The Hill, Banbury, OX15 5QL**.

Late cancellations cause considerable inconvenience to the organisers and prevent other schools from taking part. All entries received will be regarded as a definite commitment to attend the final if successful.

Judging criteria

- Organisation – being well prepared and knowing your material
- Vocal production – clarity, pitch, pace and articulation
- Performance – acting choices, movement, facial expressions
- Expressions and delivery – how well you communicate the feelings and motivations of the character

HOW TO ENTER

Entries must be submitted via the online form on the ISA website [here](#) by **Wednesday 10 November 2026** at the latest. Please note you will need to be logged in to your account to access the entry form.

- For individual video entries, **students must say their name and school at the beginning of the recording**. The time limit will start from the beginning of the performance, not at the start of the recording.
- **A working URL link must be given** for the video and accessible for at least 3 months, without a required password. ISA will not accept any files to download or links via SharePoint. Please ensure to check the sharing permissions with your school:
 - YouTube videos will need to be **unlisted**
 - Vimeo videos will need to be **unlisted** and **age rated**
 - Google Drive will need to be set to **anyone with the link**
 - OneDrive needs to be set with a **share link to anyone**

The videos are only for judging purposes and will not be shared elsewhere

COMPETITION CATEGORIES

Schools can submit a **maximum of 4 entries in each category (Learnt Monologue or Original Monologue) across all year groups**. This means that schools may submit up to 4 entries for Learnt Monologue and 4 entries for Original Monologues, making **8 entries in total**.

We encourage schools to run a competition in house and submit their best monologues.

Please note: For judging purposes, the year groups might be combined.

A. Learnt Monologue Category

Choose a monologue from any Shakespeare play, learn it by heart and perform it.

B. Original Monologue Category

Write and perform an original monologue based on your favourite Shakespeare character.

Rules

- The maximum duration for each entry is **5 minutes**.
- **AI generated entries will not be allowed in the competition.**
- Students must perform the same monologue in both rounds.
- Entries previously submitted to ISA Arts Competitions will not be accepted.
- Maximum of 4 entries per category across all year groups – 8 entries in total.
- Each monologue must be **performed by one student only**.
- Each student can enter only one monologue in the competition.
