Competition Information

Timings: Register between 10.30am-10.45am Coaches briefing 10.45am Matches will start at 11am Lunch 1-1.30pm Doubles will start at 14.30pm Finish between 15.30pm and 16.00pm

Online Entry:

When you register a team, we assume that this will be for four competitors. Once all spaces are taken, we will then ask you to name your participants in order, to see if there are any spare spaces available to open up to other schools.

Cancellation Policy:

Please make every effort to avoid withdrawing from a sporting event without exceptional circumstances. Late cancellations cause significant disruption to the planning of events, can negatively impact on others left in the competition and often sees additional financial costs for ISA to absorb. Upon entry, please ensure the event is not likely to overlap with any existing school commitments, and make sure your head teacher is aware of your visit.

Tournament Format:

- Each team registered is a maximum of 4 players.
- Each age group has a different format to account for the differing number of pupils.
- As staff we ask for your help in ensuring that if your pupils are playing next they are ready to go on court as soon as the current match finishes.
- Warm ups are limited to 30 seconds. Again, we must keep to this for the schedule to keep moving and allow for doubles in the afternoon.
- Doubles groups will be formed in the lunch break once all results are collated. We use a pairing system to ensure that all players are suited appropriately and have a positive social experience.



Scoring System, Interval and Change of Ends

- Players shall toss a coin or otherwise, the winner may decide to serve first or which end they would like.
- Players are permitted to a 30 second warm up
- A match consists of one game of 15 points.
- Every time there is a serve there is a point scored
- The side winning a rally adds a point to its score.
- At 14 all, the side which gains a 2-point lead first, wins that game.
- At 20 all, the side scoring the 21st point, wins the game.
- At the beginning of the game (0-0) and when the server's score is even, the server serves from the right service court. When the server's score is odd, the server serves from the left service court.
- If the server wins a rally, the server scores a point and then serves again from the alternate service court.
- If the receiver wins a rally, the receiver scores a point and becomes the new server. They serve from the appropriate service court – left if their score is odd, and right if it is even.
- The score should be called out audibly after every point.
- Please make sure your pupils are familiar with the scoring system and markings of the court service lines etc.

Equipment:

- Players are expected to wear suitable non-marking footwear in the sports hall.
- Own equipment is essential with changing rooms provided.
- Yonex Mavis 300 medium speed shuttlecocks will be provided for warm ups and matches.

Food:

Players are advised to bring their own food and drink for the tournament. A small café in the sports village can be used, this is not advised as the DRSV is in use by other groups and students throughout the day.

Parking:

If parking outside the David Ross Sports Village is busy, there is parking on Beeston Lane at the bottom of the DRSV drive.

Spectators:

Parents and spectators are welcome to attend the tournament, and may use the viewing gallery to spectate throughout the day.

First Aid:

There will be first aid cover provided on the day by Trident Medical Ltd and they will be clearly visible to you and spectators.
