The ISA Scrapbook Challenge encourages pupils to create scrapbook pages that express their emotions, creativity, and memories in a unique and artistic way. The scrapbook can capture different emotions like happiness, excitement, love, hope, or even moments of sadness, all expressed through colours, drawings, pictures, and words. This is a celebration of every child's imagination.

Eligibility

Only schools whose Head is a Member with ISA are eligible to enter ISA competitions. Any pupils competing must be on the main school's admissions register, on the date of the event.

Open to all ages. Our year groups are based on the UK national curriculum, for more information and to check the correct year group for your students see <u>here</u>. Please ensure you enter pupils according to the UK system, even if your own school's age group system differs.

At ISA, we are committed to making our opportunities accessible, we welcome applications from all pupils, including those with learning difficulties or disabilities. If your pupil(s), those with an EHCP or on the school's SEND register, are working at a level that differs from their age group's key stage, or if your school or student focuses on development and skills rather than year groups, please contact us.

Alternative formats of these guidelines are available on request. Please notify us at the earliest opportunity so we can provide the document accordingly, if required.

Year Groups

Schools can submit a maximum of four entries per year group. One entry only per pupil. We encourage schools to run their own competition in house and submit their successful entries in the competition. (Please note that some year groups might be combined for the judging process).

How to enter

Entries must be submitted via the online entry form on the ISA website <u>here</u> by **Monday 8 June 2026.** Please name your files with the school's name followed by the pupil name e.g. SchoolName_JohnSmith

Participants must submit the following:

- Five scrapbook pages dedicated to different emotions.
- A cover page with pupil's name and title of work
- A short artists note to explain what inspired the work

<u>Rules</u>

- Any material can be used to create the artwork i.e. drawings, stickers, magazine cutouts, scrap paper, writing or photos
- There is no limitation for wording.
- Please consider the content of the artwork as it will be shared with the judges and on our website.
- Entries must be made by one pupil only (no group entries).
- All entries must be the participants' original work, which have never been published.
- Any written materials can be in any language, provided an English translation is given.
- Images must be submitted in **JPEG or PNG format only** and must be named in the correct format.
- All the copyrights belong to the participant. However, ISA reserves the right to showcase the artworks on the ISA website and social media and to use them for marketing purposes. Please note that the name of the student might also be displayed.
- While we recognise the potential benefit of AI, we kindly request that participants are using it for inspiration and support and in line with their schools policies on its use, rather than using it to generate their artwork. Please include details about the process of using AI under "any special circumstances" box if applicable, so judges are aware.
