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Tournament Structure

- Group fixtures followed by knockout matches in the afternoon
- During a scheduled lunch break, results will be collated, and afternoon matches confirmed
- A programme with scheduling will be emailed to you 1-2 weeks before
- All matches will take place on indoor courts using centralised timing

Catering/Refreshments:

• It is advised that schools bring their own packed lunches due to the tight schedule on the day and short lunch breaks.

Tournament Rules

- Before each match starts, two captains toss for choice of end or first centre pass.
- No substitutions allowed except during half time or break for injury.
- Any blood injury to be immediately removed from play. The injured player/s may be allowed to return to court after a goal has been scored once the injury has been fully treated.
- Teams must provide own match ball
- No jewellery may be worn, and nails must be cut short.
- In the event of an injury the players safety will be prioritised. If it is deemed unsafe to move the player, the score at the time of the injury will stand.
- Players can only play for one team during the day

Officials:

- All schools <u>must</u> provide one umpire per team (Netball Europe C Umpire Award -C Award)
- If you are unable to provide an official, please contact the East Midlands Netball Umpiring Secretaries <u>HERE</u>, or post on the Facebook group <u>HERE</u> with your requirements.
- Umpires have been allocated against each match in the group stages
- Knockout matches will simply be umpired by those teams not playing, explained during coaches briefing

Warm Up:

- From 10am teams will have access to netball courts for warm up
- Please be considerate of other teams and share the space.
- We advise that you use the courts for a maximum of 10 minutes, allowing rotation of teams.

Group Matches:

5 points will be awarded for a win, 3 points for a draw, 1 point if team scored more than 50% of opponents score. In the event of two or more schools being level on points, teams will be separated as follows:

- Head to head record
- Goal difference
- Goals scored
- Goals conceded
- Coin toss

Knockout Matches:

In the event of a draw in the knockout phases, a golden goal format will take place. Team will toss for the first centre pass and the team scoring the first goal will progress to the next round.

Late Penalties:

Matches are played using central timing and where a team is late (unless for a justifiable reason), they will be penalised as follows:

- 3 + mins = 1 goal conceded
- 5 + mins = match forfeited

Playing Colours:

- Bibs must be worn, clearly displaying playing position on front and back.
- In the event of a colour clash the second name team must change colours.

First Aid:

You as staff will be responsible for initial contact with any injured player, followed by a signal/message to the first aiders on site if you require their expertise (Trident Medical).

Photography:

There will be photos taken on the day. If you have any children who cannot be photographed, then please let us know either by email or on the day.
