Celebrating the achievements of outstanding Year 6 pupils at ISA Members' schools

- **What is the Maxwell Prize?**

The Maxwell Prize celebrates the achievements of Year 6 children in education at the schools of ISA Members. The prize is non-academic and rewards a holistic approach to school and community life. The winning pupil will receive a voucher, glass trophy and certificate, which will be presented by ISA President, Lord Lexden, at the House of Lords. The judges may also choose to award certificates to runner-up and highly commended entries. The prize is named after Stanley Maxwell, who was Chair of ISA between 1909 and 1939, and was a driving force behind the association.

- **Who can be nominated?**

All ISA Members' schools are invited to nominate an outstanding pupil for the prize. Nominations are limited to one per school. The pupil must be in their final year of primary education (Year 6). Nominated pupils should have demonstrated a contribution to school and community life that goes above and beyond expectations, and be considered an all-round valuable member of the school. Achievements could include (but are not limited to); excellence in sport, music or arts, charity work, involvement in school and community projects, or commitment to extra-curricular activities.

- **Nominations**

Being nominated by the school is an achievement in itself. The names of all nominated pupils will be entered in the Roll of Honour published on our website and they will receive an ISA presentation certificate. We therefore encourage all ISA Members' schools with Year 6 students to submit a nomination. The nominee can be studying any type of curriculum.

- **Criteria**

The criteria for this award is deliberately broad. ISA Members' schools are asked to nominate their most outstanding Year 6 student. The nomination must include Part 1 and Part 2, with Part 3 an optional piece of supporting evidence. Please note that as judging takes place anonymously, **no part of the nomination must mention the name of the school, and videos must not include any identifying school badges etc.**

Part 1. A short written nomination from a staff member at the school, which tells the story of why your pupil is so special. (300 words max)

Part 2. A short statement from the nominee describing their achievements in their own words. This can be typed or filmed (300 words max. for text, 2 mins max. for video. Video must be uploaded as a URL link. We cannot accept WeTransfer or download links.)

Part 3. Optional – URL link (website page, short video) or PDF/JPEG file (short piece of text, image) which provides further evidence of the student's achievements. This must be relevant to the achievements mentioned in the statement. Only one piece of evidence can be provided – either a file upload *or* URL link. Please note, if entry levels are high there is no guarantee

that the judges will be able to read or watch all the optional evidence provided. Please make sure your application does not rely on this.

Please note: the application takes place before external examination results and does not depend on, or include, exam results.

- **How to enter**

Nominations must be made through the form on the [ISA website](#) by a member of school staff. Entries will be open **Monday 08 January – Thursday 28 March 2024**. Judges appointed by ISA will consider and adjudicate the nominations. The results will be announced shortly afterwards.
